This Northern Parula was spotted in Westchester County. These small woodwarblers are listed as vulnerable in New York by NatureServe and spotted in the area during migration.

This piping plover was observed along the Fairfield County coast. Piping plovers are listed as near threatened by the IUCN and are a state threatened species in Connecticut.


